COMPLETION OF TENURE OF MEMBER

Mr. Sharif Ahmad had joined KP PSC on 11th July, 2019. He retired on 5th July, 2023 on completion of his (05) years tenure. The services rendered by Mr. Sharif Ahmad to the Commission will be long remembered.



MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION

During the quarter under report, two meetings (10th & 11th) were convened on 04th August, and 15th September, 2023 respectively and special meeting of the Commission was held on 5th July, 2023.

The Commission discussed thoroughly the ways to tackle the new challenges emerging in the face of modern technology, the introduction of comprehensive mechanism to strengthen the examination system to make it more resilient and invulnerable to unfair means.



RECRUITMENT THROUGH WRITTEN EXAM

1) RECOMMENDATION OF ASI IN POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Commission conducted interview for the posts of Fast Track Promotion to the rank of Assistant Sub-Inspectors. 274 candidates qualified in written exam, the candidature of 7 was rejected due to various reasons while 267 candidates were called for the interview. Furthermore, 225 candidates qualified, 39 failed and 3 candidates remained absent in the viva voce. Resultantly, 74 candidates were recommended to the Provincial Government for further appointment while one post was kept pending due to the court case.

2) RECOMMENDATION OF ASI (TRAFFIC WARDEN SYSTEM) IN POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Commission finalized the recruitment of Assistant Sub Inspector (Traffic Warden System), where a total of 66 candidates appeared in the written exam in which 35 candidates passed the written competitive examination. Accordingly, the interview of the 35 candidates was conducted, in which 33 candidates qualified for final allocation in the merit list while 2 candidates failed in the interview. 44 leftover posts of ASI (Traffic Warden System) in Police Department will be re-advertised in due course of time.

RECRUITMENT THROUGH ABILITY TEST

The Commission finalized recruitment against the following **788** posts in various departments. Out of **23435** applicants, **4152** candidates were interviewed and recommendations of **745** candidates were conveyed to the government for appointment. Forty three posts remained unfilled; majority pertains to Minority Quota. Post-wise details are as follows:-

3 PROCUREMENT OF COMPUTER SYSTEMS UNDER IT PROJECT

Under the IT project named “Installation of Optical Fiber Networking, CBT and Upgradation of Existing IT system of KP PSC” the Commission received 40 new computer systems in the quarter.

4 DISPOSAL OF UNSERVICEABLE ITEMS

The Commission floated bidding notice for its unserviceable goods and IT equipments on its website and in leading newspaper. All contractors/ suppliers applied for bidding were called on 22nd September, 2023. The process was completed in accordance with the Procurement Rules of the KPPRA.

The basic price was RS 200,000/= and the proceed actualized against this is Rs 263,920/=. Beside total weight of unserviceable paper was 1085/kg @ Rs 80/kg totaling Rs 86,800/=

The above said amount has been deposited in the Government Treasury vide receipt; TT2327703255 dated 04.10.2023.

During the quarter under report, the Commission received a total number of 489 complaints out of which **462** were addressed/ resolved/answered whereas **27** complaints are under process.

The Commission received a total number of **14** requests out of which **12** were resolved/ answered whereas the remaining **02** are under process.
